Col Adam W. Shelton is the Division Chief of Command and Control, Intelligence, Surveillance, Reconnaissance, and the Advance Battle Management System capability requirements, Headquarters Air Force, Washington D.C. He is responsible for and manages five diverse Air Force branches delivering all capabilities and requirements development for C2ISR missions. In this role, he also interfaces and advocates for Air Force requirements with Major Commands, Air Staff, Joint Staff, Office of the Secretary of Defense, and Congressional Staffers. Additionally, he provides operations perspective and integrates with the Planning, Programming, Budgeting, and Execution Process while reviewing requirements and policy recomnedations for the Department of the Air Force.

Colonel Shelton entered the Air Force in 2001 as a distinguished graduate of the Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville's Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program. He has served in a variety of leadership positions including qualifications as an E-3 air battle manager instructor/evaluator, Chief Weapons and Tactics, Chief Standardization and Evaluations, Assistant Director of

Colonel Shelton has flown in and supported numerous contingency operations, some of which include Operations NOBLE EAGLE, ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM, UNIFIED PROTECTOR, NEW DAWN, and INHERENT RESOLVE.
