





As commander, Colonel Choquette is responsible for developing the combat capability of the Air and Space Operations Center and leading the Air Force's Distributed Mission Operations and live, virtual and constructive capabilities. The 505th CCW comprises the 505th Training Group at Hurlburt Field, Florida, 505th Test and Evaluation Group at Nellis Air Force Base, Nevada, and Detachment 1, 505 CCW at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.
